## **CHOOSING YOUR CONFIRMATION NAME**

Choosing a new name for Confirmation is an ancient and honorable tradition. Taking a new name can be symbolic of a new stage in life. Many of your parents probably participated in this tradition when they were confirmed. It follows in the scriptural tradition of the famous phrase, "I have called you by name" (Is 45:3-4). In the Hebrew scriptures, Abram became Abraham, and Jacob became Israel. In the New Testament the tradition continued when Simon was renamed Peter by Jesus (Mt 16:17), and Saul became Paul (Acts 13:9). The name you choose should be the name of a Saint. A Saint is someone in Heaven who strived to live life as a Christian. They were not perfect people. You should do research about the lives of different saints, what they did, why we honor them today as saints, etc. I would suggest you start by thinking about a name you like, or by seeing if a Saint's feast day is on your birthday.

# *Project 2*

## **CHOOSING YOUR CONFIRMATION SPONSOR**

Choosing your Confirmation Sponsor is a very important decision. You should take time to pray to God about who He wants you to choose as your Sponsor since He knows much better than we do. Here is some information in order to help you better understand the role of the sponsor, and a prayer to help you choose someone.

### **What is a Sponsor?**

A sponsor is a person who encourages and assists a candidate for Confirmation to embrace and actively practice the Catholic faith. The sponsor also presents the candidate to the Bishop at the celebration of Confirmation.

### **Who can be a Sponsor?**

Being a sponsor is not just an honor, it is also an important responsibility. The sponsor must be an active, practicing Catholic who can be a role model for the candidate. This can be a grandparent, aunt or uncle, sibling, other relative, family friend, teacher, etc. The Catholic Church has set the following requirements to be a sponsor:

- Must regularly attend Sunday Mass and celebrate the sacraments
- Must be fully initiated Roman Catholic (received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist)
- Must be at least 16 years old
- May NOT be the parent of the candidate

### **Prayer to help choose a Sponsor:**

Holy Spirit, helper and guide, give me wisdom as I choose my Confirmation sponsor. Help me to choose a person of prayer who will teach me also to be a person of prayer who will support me in difficult times, who will guide me to make good choices, and who will challenge me when I do not. Help me to choose someone who will love me and teach me to love Jesus. Thank you for giving me a community of people around me to support and guide me as I take this important step in becoming more fully a member of your Church. Amen.

### **Brief Summary of the Gospel:**

The Magi come searching for the King of the Jews. They followed a star and found Jesus in the city of Bethlehem. They offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

### **Reflection on what the Gospel means for you. How does it challenge you and your lifestyle?**

It makes me ask the question of how faithful I am in following/searching for Jesus in my own life.

The Kings come to Jesus through a star whose light lead them. How do I come to Jesus, what leads me to Him? Parents, Church, friends, nature? What are the signs that direct me to Jesus and allow me to proclaim Him the King, the Lord and truth of my life?

The Gospel also makes me ask – “What are the gifts that I offer to Jesus?” “How willing am I to offer them to Jesus or other people?” I guess my gift is my time with my family, especially when I help out at home. Also my being respectful of other people, especially if they are different from me.

Most importantly it is to be like the Kings and listen to how God calls me to come to Him, to follow Him. So I know that it is important to make sure I pray every day and go to Mass.

## *Project 5*

### *Service Hours/Reflection (3 parts Project)*

**a)** In preparation for this project, each candidate **is required** to read this excerpt from the **Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 12: 4-11) as follows:**

4. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit;<sup>c</sup>

5 There are different forms of service but the same Lord;

6 There are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

7 To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

8 To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit;<sup>d</sup>

9 To another faith by the same Spirit; to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit;

10 To another mighty deeds; to another prophecy; to another discernment of spirits; to another varieties of tongues; to another interpretation of tongues.<sup>e</sup>

11 But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.<sup>f</sup>

### GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

**Due May 22, 2021**

Confirmation is the sacrament that completes the grace we receive in Baptism. It seals, or confirms, this grace through the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we receive as part of Confirmation. This sacrament also makes us better able to participate in the worship and apostolic life of the Church. Like Baptism, Confirmation is received only once in a person's life.

Through Jesus, we receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

*Wisdom* helps us recognize the importance of others and the importance of keeping God central in our lives.

*Understanding* is the ability to comprehend the meaning of God's message.

*Knowledge* is the ability to think about and explore God's revelation, and also to recognize that there are mysteries of faith beyond us.

*Counsel* is the ability to see the best way to follow God's plan when we have choices that relate to him.

*Fortitude* is the courage to do what one knows is right.

*Piety* helps us pray to God in true devotion.

*Fear of the Lord* is the feeling of amazement before God, who is all-present, and whose friendship we do not want to lose. (Loyola Press)

**Easter Triduum:** These three days in which the Church remembers the Death and Resurrection of Jesus are the most important time of the Church's year. The Easter Triduum begins on Holy Thursday evening with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, continues on Good Friday with the celebration of the Lord's Passion, reaches its high point on the evening of Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil, and ends on the evening of Easter Sunday, the great feast of the Resurrection of the Lord. The seasonal color of vestments is in sequence of the days: white, red, white or gold signifying a time of joy, sorrow and sheer ecstasy in the victory of Christ. Symbols of the season are the return of the Alleluia, the return of holy water, the return, in abundance, of color and flowers, especially lilies and most traditionally in the celebration of Baptism and the reception of catechumens.
