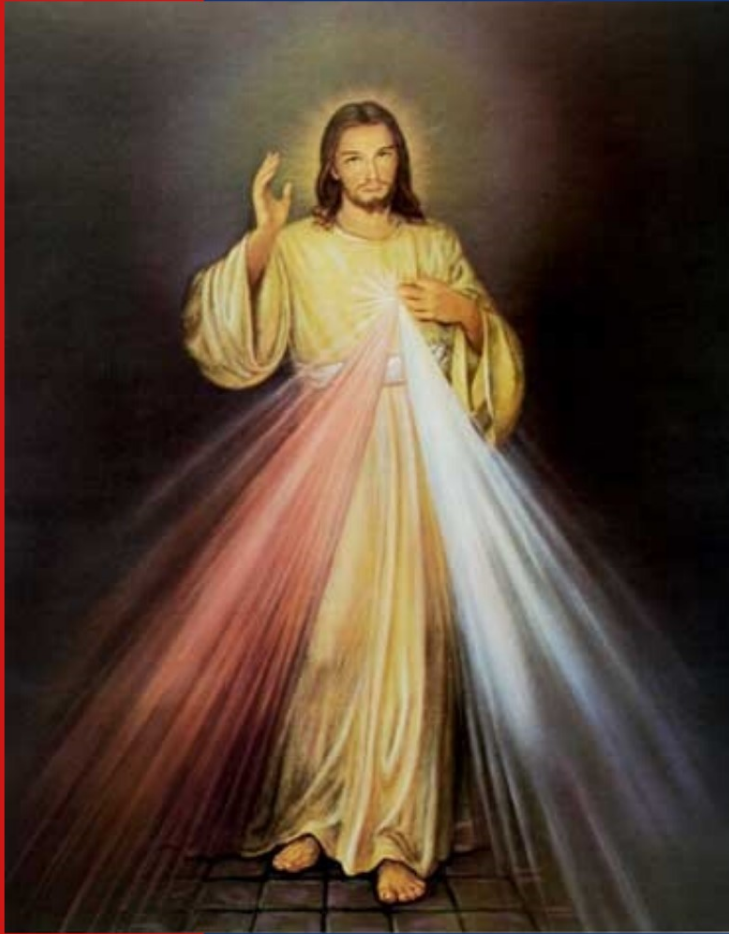

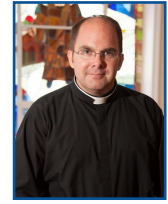

Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you. ...Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ...When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior. ...Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy. ...Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will (687, 1541, 1731).

Reflection on the book "Apostle of Mercy" published by the Vatican by Fr. David Regan



Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, an apostle of Divine Mercy, belongs today to the group of the most popular and well-known saints of the Church.

Through her, the Lord Jesus communicates to the world the great message of God's mercy and reveals the pattern of Christian perfection based on trust in God and on the attitude of mercy toward one's neighbors.

Sr. Faustina was born on August 25, 1905 in Glogowie, Poland of a poor and religious family of peasants, the third of ten children. She was baptized with the name Helena in the parish church of Swinice Warckie. From a very tender age she stood out because of her love of prayer, work, obedience, and also her sensitivity to the poor. At the age of seven she had already felt the first stirrings of a religious vocation. Helena made her first Holy Communion at the age of nine, which was very profound moment in her awareness of the presence of the Divine Guest within her soul. She attended school for three years. After finishing school, she wanted to enter the convent but her parents would not give her permission. Being of age at sixteen, Helena left home and went to work as a housekeeper in Aleksandrow, Lodi, and Ostrowek in order to find the means of supporting herself and of helping her parents.

Helena joins Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy

Helena never lost her desire for a religious vocation. After being called during a vision of the Suffering Christ, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy on August 1, 1925, and took the name Sr. Maria Faustina of the Most Blessed Sacrament. She lived in the Congregation for thirteen years in several religious houses. She spent time at Krakow, Plock and Vilnius, where she worked as a cook, gardener, and porter.

Externally, nothing revealed her rich mystical interior life. She zealously performed her tasks and faithfully observed the rule of religious life. She was recollected and at the same time very natural, serene, and full of kindness and love for her neighbor. Although her life was apparently insignificant, monotonous and dull, she hid within herself an extraordinary union with God.

It is the mystery of the Mercy of God which she contemplated in the word of God as well as in the everyday activities of her life that forms the basis of her spirituality. The process of contemplating and getting to know the mystery of God's mercy helped develop within Sr. Maria Faustina the attitude of child-like trust in God as well as mercy toward her neighbors.

Sister Faustina was a faithful daughter of the Church which she loved like a Mother and the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ. Conscious of her role in the Church, she cooperated with God's mercy in the task of saving lost souls. At the specific request of, and following the example of the Lord Jesus, she made a sacrifice of her own life for this very goal. In her spiritual life she also distinguished herself with a love of the Eucharist and a deep devotion to the Mother of Mercy.

The Secretary of God's Mercy

The Lord Jesus chose Sr. Maria Faustina as the Apostle and "Secretary" of His Mercy, so that she could tell the world about His great message, which Sr. Faustina recorded in a diary she titled *Divine Mercy in My Soul*. In the Old Covenant He said to her: "I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to My people. Today I am sending you with My mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart." (Diary 1588)

In an extraordinary way, Sr. Maria Faustina's work sheds light on the mystery of the Divine Mercy. It delights not only the simple and uneducated people, but also scholars who look upon it as an additional source of theological research. The Diary has been translated into many languages, among others, English, German, Italian, Spanish, French, Portuguese, Arabic, Russian, Hungarian, Czech, and Slovak.

Sr. Maria Faustina, consumed by tuberculosis and by innumerable sufferings which she accepted as a voluntary sacrifice for sinners, died in Krakow at the age of just 33 on October 5, 1938, with a reputation for spiritual maturity and a mystical union with God. The reputation of the holiness of her life grew as did the cult to the Divine Mercy and the graces she obtained from God through her intercession. In the years 1965-67, the Investigative Process into her life and heroic virtues was undertaken in Krakow and in the year 1968, the Beatification Process was initiated in Rome. The latter came to an end in December 1992. On April 18, 1993 our Holy Father, John Paul II raised St. Faustina to the glory of the altars. She was canonized on April 30, 2000. St. Maria Faustina's remains rest at the Sanctuary of the Divine Mercy in Krakow-Lagiewniki.



Reflexión sobre el libro "Apóstol de la Misericordia" publicado por el Vaticano Por el P. David Regan

Santa María Faustina Kowalska, apóstol de la Divina Misericordia, pertenece hoy al grupo de los santos más populares y conocidos de la Iglesia.

A través de ella, el Señor Jesús comunica al mundo el gran mensaje de la misericordia de Dios y revela el patrón de perfección cristiana basado en la confianza en Dios y en la actitud de misericordia hacia el prójimo.

Sor Faustina nació el 25 de agosto de 1905 en Glogowie, Polonia en el seno de una familia campesina pobre y religiosa; es la tercera de diez hijos. Fue bautizada con el nombre de Helena en la iglesia parroquial de Swinice Warckie. Desde muy tierna edad se destacó por su amor a la oración, al trabajo, la obediencia y también por su sensibilidad hacia los pobres. A los siete años ya había sentido los primeros impulsos de una vocación religiosa. Helena hizo su primera Comunión a los nueve años, lo cual fue un momento muy profundo en su conciencia de la presencia del Divino Huesped dentro de su alma. Asistió a la escuela durante tres años. Después de terminar la escuela, quiso ingresar al convento pero sus padres no le dieron permiso. A los dieciséis años, Helena se fue de casa y fue a trabajar como ama de llaves en Aleksandrów, Lodi y Ostrówek para encontrar los medios para mantenerse y ayudar a sus padres.

Helena se unió a las Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia

Helena nunca perdió el deseo de su vocación religiosa. Después de ser llamada durante una visión del Cristo sufriente, ingresó en la Congregación de las Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia el 1 de agosto de 1925, y tomó el nombre de Sor María Faustina del Santísimo Sacramento. Vivió en la Congregación durante trece años en varias casas religiosas. Pasó un tiempo en Cracovia, Plock y Vilnius, donde trabajó como cocinera, jardinera y portera.

Externamente nada revelaba su rica vida mística interior. Ella cumplió con celo sus tareas y observó fielmente la regla de la vida religiosa. Ella fue tranquila y al mismo tiempo muy natural, serena y llena de bondad y amor por el prójimo. Aunque su vida aparentemente era insignificante, monótona y aburrida, escondía en sí misma una unión extraordinaria con Dios.

Es el misterio de la Misericordia de Dios que ella contempló en la Palabra de Dios, así como en las actividades cotidianas de su vida, lo que formó la base de su espiritualidad. El proceso de contemplar y conocer el misterio de la misericordia de Dios ayudó a desarrollar en Sor María Faustina una actitud de confianza infantil en Dios y de misericordia hacia el prójimo.

Sor Faustina fue una hija fiel de la Iglesia a la que amó como Madre y Cuerpo Místico de Jesucristo. Consciente de su papel en la Iglesia, cooperó con la misericordia de Dios en la tarea de salvar las almas perdidas. A petición específica y siguiendo el ejemplo del Señor Jesús, ella hizo un sacrificio de su propia vida por este mismo objetivo. En su vida espiritual también se distinguió por el amor a la Eucaristía y una profunda devoción a la Madre de la Misericordia.

El secretario de la misericordia de Dios

El Señor Jesús eligió a Sor María Faustina como Apóstol y "Secretaria" de Su Misericordia, para que ella pudiera contarle al mundo su gran mensaje, que Sor Faustina registró en un diario que tituló Divina Misericordia en Mi Alma. En el Antiguo Pacto le dijo:

"Envié profetas blandiendo rayos a Mi pueblo. Hoy los envíó con Mi misericordia a los pueblos de todo el mundo. No quiero castigar a la humanidad dolorida, pero deseo curarla, presionándola contra Mi Corazón Misericordioso". (Diario 1588)

De manera extraordinaria, la obra de Sor María Faustina arroja luz sobre el misterio de la Divina Misericordia. No solo deleita a las personas sencillas y sin educación, sino también a los académicos que lo ven como una fuente adicional de investigación teológica. El Diario ha sido traducido a muchos idiomas, entre otros, inglés, alemán, italiano, español, francés, portugués, árabe, ruso, húngaro, checo y eslovaco.

Sor María Faustina, consumida por la tuberculosis y por innumerables sufrimientos que aceptaba como sacrificio voluntario por los pecadores, murió en Cracovia a los 33 años el 5 de octubre de 1938, con fama de madurez espiritual y unión mística con Dios. La reputación de la santidad de su vida creció al igual que el culto a la Divina Misericordia y las gracias que obtuvo de Dios por su intercesión. En los años 1965-67, el Proceso de Investigación de su vida y virtudes heroicas se llevó a cabo en Cracovia y en el año 1968 se inició el Proceso de Beatificación en Roma. Este último finalizó en diciembre de 1992. El 18 de abril de 1993 nuestro Santo Padre Juan Pablo II elevó a santa Faustina a la gloria de los altares. Fue canonizada el 30 de abril de 2000. Los restos de Santa María Faustina descansan en el Santuario de la Divina Misericordia en Cracovia-Lagiewniki.

Safety During COVID-19

- *Stay at home if you don't feel well or have symptoms
 - ***Masks must be worn by all present**
 - *Sanitize your hands when you enter & leave the Church
 - *Keep social distancing in the pews, as indicated by the blue tape, on the Communion line & when you exit.
Please do not remove any tape to make space to sit.
 - *Bathrooms will be locked. All hymnals have been removed. Holy water fonts are not available.
 - *Please hold your hand out FLAT when receiving Communion. **As per Diocesan directives, you must not wear gloves.** Keep your face covering ON until right before you receive, then immediately put it back on after receiving Communion.
- If you must receive by mouth, wait till the end of the line. The priest will sanitize his hands after each person.
- *There are collection boxes placed in the main aisle where you can place your donation.
 - *The Church will be sanitized daily.
