In his encyclical on the Sacred Heart entitled *Haurietis Aquas* ("You Will Draw Waters"), Pope Pius XII notes that the genesis of the devotion to the Sacred Heart lies in the covenant of love from the Old Testament. He writes that "in the New Testament, the love that breathes from the Gospel, from the letters of the Apostles and the pages of the Apocalypse all portray the love of the Heart of Jesus." He is linking this devotion to the Old Testament that was brought to life in Christ in the New Testament.

Archbishop Raymond L. Burke writes that "The early Fathers of the Church taught that, in the Heart of Jesus, the Christian finds the source of his or her life in Christ. Even as the Church herself came to birth from the wounded side of Christ, so does each Christian come to life spiritually from His glorious Pierced Heart whichever pours out the sevenfold gift of the Holy Spirit upon us."

St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1070-1153) inspired many to take a closer look at the Heart of Christ and view this heart as a source of our love of God and others.

St. Francis of Assisi and St. Bonaventure (13th Century) both had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart. In fact, St. Francis of Assisi was St. Margaret Mary's "soul-guide" for her apostolic work. St. Margaret Mary wrote, "After I had seen all this, the Divine Bridegroom, as a token of His love, gave me St. Francis as my soul's guide. He was to lead me through all the pains and sufferings that awaited me."

St. John Eudes of France. St. John was an ardent proponent of the Sacred Hearts and wrote the proper for the Mass and Divine Office for the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Church has been considering naming him a Doctor of the Church for quite a while, and this effort has gained momentum over the past six years.

St. Frances De Sales 17th century French Bishop, spiritual writer, and Saint who helped to promote this devotion. In the Treatise on the Love of God, St. Francis lays out the foundation of the devotion. St. Francis would greatly influence **St. Jane Frances de Chantal** who was the foundress of the Sisters of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the very order that St. Margaret Mary Alacoque would later join.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was born in 1647 in Burgundy, France. Her father died when she was eight years old. After he passed away, Margaret and her mother were subjected to persecution and captivity in their own home by their relatives. This period of intense suffering brought her closer to Christ and strengthened her spiritual development. She had a very difficult childhood but prayed to God to protect her vocation to become a religious. She became a nun in the Visitation order in 1672 at the convent at Paray-le-Monial.

Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, perhaps close to forty times. The first apparition occurred in the Chapel at Paray-le-Monial on December 27, 1673. The last apparition occurred less than two years later in June 1675. She saw His heart engulfed in flames and surrounded by thorns and heard His gentle voice: "Behold this Heart, which has loved so much but

has received nothing but coldness, indifference, and ingratitude in return." From her cloister, St. Margaret Mary promoted the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, First Friday Devotion, The Twelve Promises & the Holy Hour of Reparation.

Fr. Claude de la Colombiere was named rector at the Jesuit college at Paray-le-Monial and became the spiritual advisor for Sr. Margaret Mary. She was filled with anxiety and uncertainty about what she was experiencing, and many of the nuns in the convent viewed her with suspicion. The Lord was communicating through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque that the world should be devoted to His Sacred Heart. Fr. Colombiere assured St. Margaret Mary that her visions were authentic. He also instructed her to write down all that she had experienced. Fr. Colombiere pledged himself to the mission of spreading the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Father Claude de la Colombiere was transferred to England where he was imprisoned and developed serious health issues. He returned to France and died at Paray-le-Monial in 1682. He was beatified in 1929 and was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1992.

Father Mateo Crawley – Boevey, SS.CC is called the Father of the Sacred Heart Crusade. He was a member of the Fathers of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Father Mateo had a strong commitment to spreading the devotion to the Sacred Heart. During this early stage of his priesthood, he began to develop the idea of installing the image of the Sacred Heart in the place of honor in the home, to *enthroned* the home to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1907, he was sent to Europe in an attempt by his superiors to help him recuperate from exhaustion and illness. During his first stop in Rome, he submitted a plan for Enthronements to Cardinal Vives, a family friend from Chile who told him "It's a magnificent work. You must consecrate your life to it." Following this response, Father Mateo sought an audience with Pope Pius X and presented his plan for this apostolate. Pope Pius X responded: "**Not only do I permit you, but I command you to give your life for this work of social salvation.**"

He left Rome and traveled to Paray-le-Monial. While praying in the sanctuary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart on August 24, 1907, Father Mateo felt his body tremble and was immediately cured of his illness. As he prayed in thanksgiving, he had a full illumination of the plan he was to undertake for the Christian regeneration of families and society. He spent the next 45 years preaching in Europe, the United States, Central and South America, China, Asia and throughout the world establishing missionaries to Enthroned homes to the Sacred Heart.

In 1899, **Pope Leo XIII** consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Since then, his successors have exhorted the faithful to turn to the Sacred Heart and make acts of personal consecration. They have also begged the faithful to offer prayers and penances to the Sacred Heart in reparation for the many sins of the world.

En su encíclica sobre el Sagrado Corazón titulada *Haurietis Aquas* ("Sacarás aguas"), el Papa Pío XII señala que la génesis de la devoción al Sagrado Corazón se encuentra en la alianza de amor del Antiguo Testamento. Escribe que "en el Nuevo Testamento, el amor que se respira en el Evangelio, en las cartas de los Apóstoles y en las páginas del Apocalipsis, todo retrata el amor del Corazón de Jesús". Él está vinculando esta devoción al Antiguo Testamento que fue traído a la vida en Cristo en el Nuevo Testamento.

El arzobispo Raymond L. Burke escribe que "Los primeros Padres de la Iglesia enseñaron que, en el Corazón de Jesús, el cristiano encuentra la fuente de su vida en Cristo. Así como la Iglesia misma nació del costado herido de Cristo, así cada cristiano cobra vida espiritualmente de Su glorioso Corazón Traspasado, cualquiera que sea el que derrame el don séptuple del Espíritu Santo sobre nosotros".

San Bernardo de Claraval (1070-1153) inspiró a muchos a mirar más de cerca el Corazón de Cristo y ver este corazón como una fuente de nuestro amor por Dios y por los demás.

San Francisco de Asís y San Buenaventura (siglo XIII) tenían una profunda devoción al Sagrado Corazón. De hecho, San Francisco de Asís fue el "guía del alma" de Santa Margarita María para su trabajo apostólico. Santa Margarita María escribió: "Después de haber visto todo esto, el Divino Esposo, como muestra de Su amor, me dio a San Francisco como guía de mi alma. Él me guiaría a través de todos los dolores y sufrimientos que me esperaban". **San Juan Eudes de Francia**. San Juan fue un ardiente defensor de los Sagrados Corazones y escribió lo propio para la Misa y Oficio Divino para los Sagrados Corazones de Jesús y María. La Iglesia ha estado considerando nombrarlo Doctor de la Iglesia durante bastante tiempo, y este esfuerzo ha ganado impulso en los últimos seis años.

San Francisco de Sales Obispo francés del siglo XVII, escritor espiritual y santo que ayudó a promover esta devoción. En el Tratado del amor de Dios, San Francisco establece el fundamento de la devoción. San Francisco influiría mucho en **Santa Juana Frances de Chantal**, quien fue la fundadora de las Hermanas de la Visitación de la Santísima Virgen María, la misma orden a la que se uniría más tarde Santa Margarita María Alacoque. **Santa Margarita María Alacoque** nació en 1647 en Borgoña, Francia. Su padre murió cuando ella tenía ocho años. Después de su muerte, Margaret y su madre fueron objeto de persecución y cautiverio en su propia casa por parte de sus familiares. Este período de intenso sufrimiento la acercó a Cristo y fortaleció su desarrollo espiritual. Tuvo una infancia muy difícil, pero rezó a Dios para que protegiera su vocación de religiosa. Se convirtió en monja en la orden de la Visitación en 1672 en el convento de Paray-le-Monial.

Jesús se apareció a Santa Margarita María, quizás cerca de cuarenta veces. La primera aparición ocurrió en la Capilla de Paray-le-Monial el 27 de diciembre de 1673. La última aparición ocurrió menos de dos años después, en junio de 1675. Ella vio Su corazón envuelto en llamas y rodeado de espinas y escuchó Su suave voz: "He aquí este Corazón, que ha amado tanto pero no ha recibido más que frialdad, indiferencia e ingratitud a

cambio". Desde su claustro, Santa Margarita María promovió la Fiesta del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, la Devoción del Primer Viernes, Las Doce Promesas y la Hora Santa de Reparación.

P. Claude de la Columbiere fue nombrado rector del colegio jesuita de Paray-le-Monial y se convirtió en consejero espiritual de Sor Margaret Mary. Estaba llena de ansiedad e incertidumbre por lo que estaba experimentando, y muchas de las monjas del convento la miraban con sospecha. El Señor estaba comunicando a través de Santa Margarita María Alacoque que el mundo debería estar dedicado a Su Sagrado Corazón. P. Colombiere le aseguró a Santa Margarita María que sus visiones eran auténticas. También le indicó que escribiera todo lo que había experimentado. P. Colombiere se comprometió a la misión de difundir la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. El padre Claude de la Columbiere fue trasladado a Inglaterra, donde fue encarcelado y desarrolló graves problemas de salud. Regresó a Francia y murió en Paray-le-Monial en 1682. Fue beatificado en 1929 y canonizado por el Papa Juan Pablo II en 1992.

El Padre Mateo Crawley - Boevey, SS.CC es llamado el Padre de la Cruzada del Sagrado Corazón. Fue miembro de los Padres de la Congregación de los Sagrados Corazones de Jesús y María. El Padre Mateo tenía un fuerte compromiso por difundir la devoción al Sagrado Corazón. Durante esta primera etapa de su sacerdocio, comenzó a desarrollar la idea de instalar la imagen del Sagrado Corazón en el lugar de honor del hogar, para *entronizar* el hogar al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. En 1907, sus superiores lo enviaron a Europa en un intento por ayudarlo a recuperarse del agotamiento y la enfermedad. Durante su primera parada en Roma, presentó un plan de Entronizaciones al Cardenal Vives, un amigo de la familia de Chile que le dijo: "Es una obra magnífica. Debes consagrar tu vida a ello". Tras esta respuesta, el padre Mateo pidió audiencia al Papa Pío X y presentó su plan para este apostolado. El Papa Pío X respondió: "**No solo te permito, sino que te mando que entregues tu vida por esta obra de salvación social**".

Dejó Roma y viajó a Paray-le-Monial. Mientras rezaba en el santuario de las apariciones del Sagrado Corazón el 24 de agosto de 1907, el Padre Mateo sintió que su cuerpo temblaba y fue inmediatamente curado de su enfermedad. Mientras oraba en acción de gracias, tuvo una completa iluminación del plan que iba a emprender para la regeneración cristiana de las familias y la sociedad. Pasó los siguientes 45 años predicando en Europa, Estados Unidos, América Central y del Sur, China, Asia y en todo el mundo estableciendo misioneros para entronizar hogares al Sagrado Corazón.

En 1899, el **Papa León XIII** consagró el mundo al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Desde entonces, sus sucesores exhortaron a los fieles a dirigirse al Sagrado Corazón y realizar actos de consagración personal. También han rogado a los fieles que ofrezcan oraciones y penitencias al Sagrado Corazón en reparación por los muchos pecados del mundo.

Meditations

Baptismal bargain

When we are baptized, God forms an unbreakable covenant with us promising His unconditional love.

“For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord” (Romans 8:38-39).

Our part of the bargain is to obey him and love Him, and put Him first in our lives. At Baptism, we are marked as God’s child for life. That won’t change.

June 11 - Sacred Heart of Jesus. The image of Jesus with His heart exposed in unquenchable flame is a reminder of His intense and eternal love for us.

June 12 - Immaculate Heart of Mary. In response to a request by Our Lady of Fatima, Pope Pius XII consecrated the world to Mary’s gentle and devout Immaculate Heart in 1942, and initiated this feast in 1945.

June 21 - St. Aloysius Gonzaga (1591). St. Aloysius prayed vigorously and fasted from age 7. Upon joining the Society of Jesus, he was ordered to cut back on penance in order to study and spend time with the other students. He died while nursing the sick.

Ways to Support Our Parish

Covid 19 has impacted our families and Church in many ways. This parish was pained by losing her kind and compassionate pastor, Msgr. Rom, due to Covid-19. Around Long Island, churches have seen an average decline of offering by 20 percent. Here at Holy Name of Mary, we are averaging a weekly decline of 30-40 percent in offerings.

Please consider what your family is capable of giving. Consider the needs of your family, how the pandemic impacted your home, speak and pray about it as a family and then, if you are able, please consider a commitment to increasing your offering. The opportunities to give are:

- ◆ **Envelope System**-If you are a registered parishioner, you should be receiving donation envelopes in the mail. If you are not registered, please stop by the Parish Office to fill in a short registration form.
- ◆ **Faith Direct**-The best way to ensure our parish receives the support needed for our operating expenses and ministries is with eGiving through Faith Direct. It is easy to enroll; www.faithdirect.net and use our Church code, NY78.

COVID-19 - UPDATES

- *Stay at home if you don't feel well or have symptoms
- *Masks must continue to be worn by all present in the Church, even if you are fully vaccinated.
- *Sanitize your hands when you enter & leave the Church
- *Keep social distancing, as best as possible, when in the pews and on the Communion line.
- *No Sign of Peace
- *Bathrooms are opened.
- *Hymnals will return next weekend.
- *Holy water fonts will remain empty, however, holy water will be available in the tank in the hallway by the crying room.
- *As per Diocesan directives, you must not wear gloves when receiving Communion. Keep your face covering ON until right before your receive, then immediately put it back on after receiving Communion.
- *The ushers will be passing the collection baskets. The collection boxes will remain down the main aisle where you can continue to place your donation.
- *Holy Hour will return on Thursdays beginning June 10.
- *Church is open weekdays from: 8am-3:30pm.
- *All entrances of the Church are open.

Get to Know the Saints



St. Romuald (951-1027)
Feast Day: June 19

"Sit in your cell as in paradise. Put the whole world behind you and forget it. Watch your thoughts like a good fisherman watching for fish. The path you must follow is in the Psalms – never leave it."

St. Romuald was born at Ravenna about the year 956. In spite of an infinite desire for virtue and sanctity, his early life was wasted in the service of the world and its pleasures. Then one day, obliged by his father, Sergius, to be present at a duel fought by him, he beheld him slay his adversary. The crime made such an impression upon him that he determined to expiate it for forty days, as though it were entirely his own. For this purpose he retired to a Benedictine monastery of St. Apollinare, near Ravenna, where he became Abbot.

After founding several monasteries, he laid the foundations of the austere Order of Camaldoli in Tuscany. Like all the saints, he fought a lifelong battle against the assaults of devils and men.

In the beginning of his spiritual life he was strongly assailed by numerous temptations, which he conquered by vigilance and prayer. More than one attempt was made on his life, but Divine Providence enabled him to escape from the danger.

Like many servants of God, he also became the victim of calumny, which he bore in patience and silence. In his old age, he increased his austerities instead of diminishing them. After a long life of merit, he died in the monastery of Castro, which he founded in Marquisate of Ancona. His death occurred on June 19, about the year 1027.

Christ is a gentle leader, but he calls us to total holiness. Now and then, men and women are raised up to challenge us by the absoluteness of their dedication, the vigor of their spirit, the depth of their conversion. The fact that we cannot duplicate their lives does not change the call to us to be totally open to God in our own particular circumstances.

Diversión en el día de campo

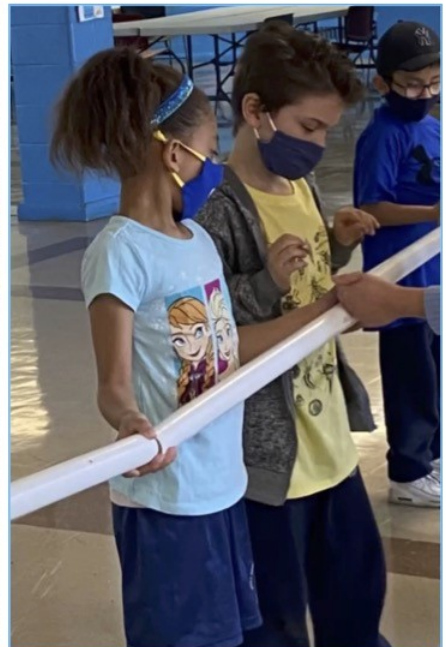
