Presider Subject $\mathcal{T}o$ change

Dear Parishioners.

Please offer a brief prayer that I might have the right words to address an important issue regarding our Church family.

We have a beautiful family here. I truly mean it when I state at every Solemnity that "... if you have traveled here, we're your home away from home...if you come every weekend, thanks for making each person fulfilled and glorifying the Sacred Trinity... but for those we see only a few times, please know that we are better when you are here more and you are better... the people here deserve the best, they have the Eucharist but they do not have you... please come back!"

During my daily Evening Prayer, I thank Jesus for my parish family, implore the vast army of saints and martyrs for my parish family, and pray that I become a better priest and pastor then I was the day before. Part of serving as pastor is being a good administrator and steward of resources. We are grateful for every good gift people give in making our Church a family. These gifts include time, talent and treasure.

Part of being a good steward-pastor-administrator is the proper administration of the Church's financial resources as well as budgetary development and implementation.

As this letter moves into addressing parish finances, let me highlight a few positive points.

- The school's subsidy has been budgeted under 15% for the upcoming 21/22 year. For the past 5 years the subsidy has ended over 22%.
- We have partnered with Morning Star Initiative.
 This means that there is a strategic plan for keeping our school healthy, growing and financially sustainable. The Chaminade brothers are now a part of our leadership team which includes the pastor, principal and school board.
- The first small business loan from the Federal Government has been applied correctly and has therefore been transitioned into a grant. We anticipate the second loan to have the same result.
- 4. We are forming a Finance Council. Canon # 537: "In each parish, there is to be a Finance Council to help the parish priest in the

administration of the goods of the parish."

HNOM has not had a Finance Council in over six years. The plan is to have this small group of qualified people in place by December 2021. Their purpose is to help lead with stewardship initiatives, communication, accountability and transparency.

5. OFFERING INCREASE PROGRAM. In the next few weeks, we will be addressing the need to increase our weekly offering with the help of a charitable advisory group called "Changing Our World."

I take the responsibility of being pastor with utmost diligence and seriousness especially with regards to the stewardship of finances. The pandemic hurt everyone however; considering the collections of HNOM have been gradually decreasing (Or flat) over the past 6 years we are in a pre-crisis. From March 2020 through August 2020, our collections were down approximately 40%. From September 2020 through February 2021 our collections were down approximately 30%. Even though our weekly Mass attendance has been risen, we are still consistently short 35% of our weekly need.

This letter is being written to genuinely ask you to prayerfully consider your stewardship and weekly offering. We consistently have over 1,200 families attending weekly Mass. If each family contributed \$20 that would exceed our weekly need. If 100 people contributed \$100, a 100 people contributed \$50, and 100 people contributed \$20 then our parish would slowly regain its health.

In the next few weeks, we will be addressing these issues. In the meantime, please reflect as a family, and reconsider your weekly offering. We are a wonderful family! We depend on God's grace, and we also are entrusted to each other because God can only give the very best.

Tenemos una hermosa familia aquí. Durante mi oración vespertina diaria, agradezco a Jesús por mi familia parroquial, imploro al vasto ejército de santos y mártires por mi familia parroquial, y oro para convertirme en un mejor sacerdote y pastor que el día anterior. A parte de servir como pastor trato de ser un buen administrador y mayordomo de recursos. Estamos agradecidos por cada buen regalo que las personas dan para hacer de nuestra Iglesia una familia. Estos dones incluyen tiempo, talento y tesoro.

A parte de ser un buen mayordomo-pastor-administrador en la administración adecuada de los recursos financieros de la Iglesia, así como el desarrollo y la implementación presupuestaria; a medida que esta carta avanza hacia las finanzas de la parroquia, permítanme resaltar algunos puntos positivos.

- El subsidio de la escuela se ha presupuestado por debajo del 15% para el próximo año 21/22. Durante los últimos 5 años, el subsidio ha terminado en más del 22%.
- 2. Nos hemos asociado con Morning Star Initiative.
 Esto significa que existe un plan estratégico
 para mantener nuestra escuela saludable, en
 crecimiento y financieramente sostenible.
 Los hermanos Chaminade ahora son parte de
 nuestro equipo de liderazgo que incluye al pastor,
 el director y la junta escolar.
- El primer préstamo para pequeñas empresas del Gobierno Federal se ha aplicado correctamente y, por lo tanto, se ha convertido en una subvención. Anticipamos que el segundo préstamo tendrá el mismo resultado.

- 4. Estamos formando un Consejo de Finanzas. Canon # 537: "En cada parroquia, debe haber un Consejo de Finanzas para ayudar al párroco en la administración de los bienes de la parroquia". HNOM no ha tenido un Consejo de Finanzas en más de 6 años. El plan es tener este pequeño grupo de personas calificadas para diciembre de 2021. Su propósito es ayudar a liderar con iniciativas de administración, comunicación, responsabilidad y transparencia.
- OFRECER PROGRAMA DE AUMENTO. En las próximas semanas, abordaremos la necesidad de aumentar nuestra oferta semanal con la ayuda de un grupo asesor benéfico llamado "Changing Our World".


Asumo la responsabilidad de ser pastor con la mayor diligencia y seriedad, especialmente en lo que respecta a la administración de las finanzas. Sin embargo, la pandemia afectó a todos; Considerando que las recaudaciones de HNOM han ido disminuyendo gradualmente (o sin cambios) durante los últimos 6 años, estamos en una pre-crisis. Desde marzo de 2020 hasta agosto de 2020, nuestras colectas bajaron aproximadamente un 40%. Desde septiembre de 2020 hasta febrero de 2021, nuestras colectas bajaron aproximadamente un 30%. A pesar de que nuestra asistencia a misa semanal ha aumentado, todavía estamos constantemente cortos del 35% de nuestra necesidad semanal.

Esta carta está siendo escrita para pedirle sinceramente que considere con espíritu de oración su mayordomía y su ofrenda semanal. Constantemente tenemos más de 1,200 familias que asisten a la Misa semanal. Si cada familia aportara \$ 20, eso excedería nuestra necesidad semanal. Si 100 personas contribuyeron con \$ 100, 100 personas contribuyeron con \$ 50 y 100 personas contribuyeron con \$ 20, entonces nuestra parroquia recuperaría lentamente su salud.

En las próximas semanas, abordaremos estos problemas. Mientras tanto, reflexionen como familia y reconsideren su ofrenda semanal. ¡Somos una familia maravillosa! Dependemos de la gracia de Dios y también estamos confiados unos a otros porque Dios solo puede dar lo mejor.



Get to Know the Saints

It is said that Robert Bellarmine was so short that he used to stand on a stool to be seen over the high pulpits of Europe. But he was a giant in many other ways.

Robert, born in Italy in 1542, was the third of ten children in a family in which prayer and serving others were priorities. He entered the Society of Jesus, the Jesuits, in 1560. Robert was a brilliant student at the Roman College and eventually taught at the University of Louvain in Belgium. His sermons and his defense of the faith

and many were converted. Robert was ordained in 1570, became rector at the Roman College in 1592, and was named superior of the Naples province in 1594. By 1598, he was named a cardinal, and in 1602, he became archbishop of Capua. He was called to Rome in 1605 to work in defense of the Church against heresies. Robert, who was advisor to five popes, was involved in many controversies. One involved the teachings of the scientist Galileo, who was also Robert's friend. In 1931, Robert was declared a Doctor of the Church.

Like Saint Robert, let us use all our gifts from God. May we study hard, pray often, and serve others so that the world will see the greatness of our God.


