From May 13 to October 13, 1917, the Blessed Mother appeared to three Portuguese children in Fatima, a town located 100 miles north of the capital city of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for the conversion of sinners and of Russia.

There are two things that we can say about the Marian

Apparition at Fatima. It is eucharistic and prophetic. First, this apparition is profoundly eucharistic. A few months before the Blessed Mother's appearance, an angel who introduced himself as the Angel of Peace first appeared to the children for three times, and taught them some prayers of reparation. The following is one of the prayers: "Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly, and I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifference with which He Himself is offended. And, through the infinite merits of His most Sacred Heart, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of You the conversion of poor sinners."

On the third appearance, the angel gave Holy Communion on the tongue to the children. He gave the host to Lucia, and the contents of the chalice to Francisco and Jacinta, saying as he did so: "Take and drink the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, horribly outraged by ungrateful men. Make reparation for their crimes and console your God".

This clearly shows that our Marian devotion should always lead to Jesus in the Eucharist and must be aimed at making reparation for all the offenses against this august sacrament on the altar. It is, therefore, fitting that when praying the Rosary, we recite after every decade, not only the Fatima Prayer ("O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from fires of Hell...") but also the short Eucharistic praise: "O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine."

And secondly, Fatima is the most prophetic among all Marian apparitions. In the first place, it reveals more clearly and definitively the role of Mary as the Woman in Battle (Gen 3:15), as the Woman-Mother (Jn 19:26-27), and as the Woman in Triumph (Rev 12:1). The Blessed Mother also revealed to the children the three secrets.

The first secret was a message describing the vision of Hell, where, Our Lady told the children, many souls were falling and no one is praying and doing sacrifices for their salvation.

The second was Our Lady's warning that there would be another war. If man did not convert, Russia would spread its errors of Communism throughout the world and the world would suffer a great chastisement.

The third secret was formally revealed only in the year 2000, upon the instruction of Pope St. John Paul II. It referred to the most severe crisis in the Church, such as persecutions, mass apostasy, spread of errors, confusions and divisions of great proportions and other catastrophic events in the world: "The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; various nations will be annihilated". However, the central message of Fatima is fully consistent with what the Church has always taught. Pope Benedict XVI says that the message of Fatima is "the exhortation to prayer as the path of "salvation for souls" and, likewise, "the summons to penance and conversion."

After Fatima, the Blessed Mother has appeared so many times throughout the years and in so many parts of the world. Her messages, exhortation and appeals are consistently the same, but with more sense of urgency and gravity.

As our loving Mother, she calls on all her children to take the path of righteousness and holiness, for she does not want to see them fall into the hands of the Evil One. Therefore, she urges them to consecrate their lives to her Immaculate Heart. As Pope Benedict XVI explains, "The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind."

Mary, the all-powerful Queen of Heaven and Earth, is the 'Woman Clothed with the Sun', the victorious Woman of the Apocalypse. This she affirms in her solemn declaration at Fatima: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph."

Hold on to Mary, faithfully heed her call to prayer and conversion, and consecrate ourselves to her Immaculate Heart. Then, we are assured that she will lead us to her Son, Jesus, to be with Him in His victory and eternal glory.

"The mission of the Church requires the entire People of God to be on a journey together, with each member playing his or her crucial role, united with each other. A synodal Church walks forward in communion to pursue a common mission through the participation of each and every one of her members. The objective of this Synodal Process is not to provide a temporary or onetime experience of synodality, but rather to provide an opportunity for the entire People of God to discern together..."

(Vademecum for the Synod on Synodality #1.3).

Through Synodality, Pope Francis is asking the Church to rediscover its deeply synodal roots and to reflect on how the path of synodality is the way for the entire People of God to journey forward together. To summarize the Holy Father is encouraging us to participate in moments of reflection, discernment, discussion and listening. Holy Name of Mary is participating in this invitation from Pope Francis, as well as Bishop Barres.

On **Wednesday, May 18** immediately **following the 7:30 P.M. Mass** there will be a directed opportunity for people to share their faith experiences and what they would like to be heard from their heart regarding their faith journey. small presentation will be made in order to facilitate group discussion. **Another opportunity** will be given on **Monday, May 23 at 7 P.M.**

"La misión de la Iglesia requiere que todo el Pueblo de Dios esté en camino juntos, con cada miembro desempeñando su papel crucial, unidos entre sí. Una Iglesia sinodal camina hacia adelante en comunión para perseguir una misión común a través de la participación de todos y cada uno de sus miembros. Del 13 de mayo al 13 de octubre de 1917, la Santísima Madre se apareció a tres niños portugueses en Fátima, un pueblo ubicado a 100 millas al norte de la ciudad capital de Lisboa. María pidió a los niños que rezaran el rosario por la paz mundial, por el fin de la Primera Guerra Mundial, por la conversión de los pecadores y de Rusia.

Hay dos cosas que podemos decir sobre la Aparición Mariana en Fátima. Es eucarístico y profético. En primer lugar, esta aparición es profundamente eucarística. Unos meses antes de la aparición de la Santísima Madre, un ángel que se presentó como el Ángel de la Paz se apareció por primera vez a los niños tres veces y les enseñó algunas oraciones de reparación. La siguiente es una de las oraciones:

"Santísima Trinidad, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, os adoro profundamente y os ofrezco el preciantísimo Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad de Jesucristo, presente en todos los sagrarios del mundo, en reparación de los ultrajes, sacrilegios e indiferencias con que Él mismo es ofendido. Y, por los méritos infinitos de su Sacratísimo Corazón y del Inmaculado Corazón de María, te suplico la conversión de los pobres pecadores".

En la tercera aparición, el ángel dio la Sagrada Comunión en la lengua a los niños. Dio la hostia a Lucía, y el contenido del cáliz a Francisco y Jacinta, diciendo al hacerlo: "Tomad y bebed el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo, horriblemente ultrajado por los hombres ingratos. Repara sus crímenes y consuela a tu Dios".

Esto muestra claramente que nuestra devoción mariana debe conducir siempre a Jesús en la Eucaristía y debe estar encaminada a reparar todas las ofensas contra este augusto sacramento en el altar. Por lo tanto, es apropiado que al rezar el Rosario, recitemos después de cada decena, no solo la Oración de Fátima ("Oh Jesús mío, perdónanos nuestros pecados, sálvanos del fuego del infierno..."), sino también la breve alabanza eucarística: "Oh Sacramento santísimo, Oh Sacramento divino, toda alabanza y toda acción de gracias sean Tuyas en todo momento."

Y en segundo lugar, Fátima es la más profética de todas las apariciones marianas. En primer lugar, revela más clara y definitivamente el papel de María como Mujer en la Batalla (Gn 3,15), como Mujer-Madre (Jn 19,26-27), y como Mujer en Triunfo (Ap 12:1). La Santísima Madre también reveló a los niños los tres secretos. El primer secreto fue un mensaje que describía la visión del Infierno, donde, Nuestra Señora les dijo a los niños, muchas almas estaban cayendo y nadie estaba orando y haciendo sacrificios por su salvación.

El segundo fue la advertencia de Nuestra Señora de que habría otra guerra. Si el hombre no se convertía, Rusia esparciría sus errores del Comunismo por el mundo y el mundo sufriría un gran castigo.

Y el tercer secreto fue revelado formalmente recién en el año 2000, por instrucción del Papa San Juan Pablo II. Se refería a la crisis más severa de la Iglesia, como persecuciones, apostasía masiva, propagación de errores, confusiones y divisiones de grandes proporciones y otros eventos catastróficos en el mundo: "Los buenos serán martirizados; el Santo Padre tendrá mucho que sufrir; varias naciones serán aniquiladas".

Sin embargo, el mensaje central de Fátima es plenamente coherente con lo que la Iglesia siempre ha enseñado. El Papa Benedicto XVI dice que el mensaje de Fátima es "la exhortación a la oración como camino de "salvación de las almas" y, asimismo, "la llamada a la penitencia y a la conversión".

Después de Fátima, la Santísima Madre se ha aparecido tantas veces a lo largo de los años y en tantas partes del mundo. Sus mensajes, exhortaciones y llamados son consistentemente los mismos, pero con más sentido de urgencia y gravedad. Como nuestra Madre amorosa, llama a todos sus hijos a emprender el camino de la justicia y de la santidad, porque no quiere verlos caer en manos del Maligno. Por eso, los insta a consagrar sus vidas a su Inmaculado Corazón. Como explica el Papa Benedicto XVI, "El Corazón abierto a Dios, purificado por la contemplación de Dios, es más fuerte que las pistolas y las armas de todo tipo".

María, la Reina todopoderosa del Cielo y de la Tierra, es la 'Mujer Vestida de Sol', la Mujer victoriosa del Apocalipsis. Así lo afirma en su declaración solemne en Fátima: "Al final, mi Inmaculado Corazón triunfará". Aferrarnos a María, atender fielmente su llamada a la oración ya la conversión, y consagrarnos a su Inmaculado Corazón. Entonces, estamos seguros de que ella nos conducirá a su Hijo, Jesús, para estar con Él en Su victoria y gloria eterna.




BANNS OF MARRIAGE

Christopher Magallanes was born in 1869 in the province of Guadalajara, Mexico, of devout parents who were poor farmers. As a youth, he worked as a shepherd, but felt called to be a shepherd of souls. He entered the seminary at nineteen and was ordained at the age of thirty. He worked as a parish priest in his hometown of Totatiche for two decades, and there also opened a carpentry business to help provide jobs for the local men.

When, in the first decades of the twentieth century, the atheistic Mexican government launched a merciless persecution of the Catholic Church, a new constitution banned the training of priests. In 1915, Fr. Christopher opened his own small seminary in Totatiche where he soon had a dozen students. Consequently accused of trying to incite rebellion, Fr. Christopher was arrested on his way to say Mass, imprisoned and condemned to be shot without trial.

His few possessions he gave away to his jailer and he was executed on May 21, 1927 with another twenty-one priests and three lay Catholics. His last words were: "I die innocent, and ask God that my blood may serve to unite my Mexican brethren." He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on May 21, 2000.
