"If you really keep the royal law found in Scripture, 'Love your neighbor as yourself,' you are doing right. But if you show favoritism, you sin and are convicted by the law as lawbreakers. For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it. " (James 2:8-10)

St. James was addressing the issue of no partiality towards the poor and the rich. Why? The simple fact, that in Jesus, there is no partiality. Both rich and poor are made in the image and likeness of God and as such are created equal in their dignity. They are equal in the eyes of their Creator. That is why St. James was reminding the early Christians that there is to be no favoritism or partiality among them.

Today, we have a partiality problem of our own. Perhaps not so much with the poor and rich, but we have a problem in another area. It has been the hot topic in the papers, on TV, in political debates, etc... **Abortion is our partiality problem.** God has made both the baby in the womb and the mother in His image and likeness and as such they are created equal in the eyes of God. However, we hear in our day, a "woman has the right to choose." You know what we are to say to people who claim that as a right? *Choose what?* We need to finish the sentence for them. I love to make a choice between what type of pasta I will eat. However, if my choice will hurt or even kill another innocent human being, than that choice is wrong. We must love **both** the child and the mother. We are pro woman and pro child!

You may also hear some people crying out for exceptions. Perhaps you heard some say... *"What about the health of the mother?"* Let me first say that the Church teaches that we try to save them both. She never places one life over another. She says save them both but we can never directly take the life of one to save the other. Furthermore, we live in an age when modern technology is so great that this case is practically non existent. They have procedures where they can operate on the child in the womb now. Don't take just my word on this, here is what the former surgeon general, C-Everett Koop, has said about the situation of the "life of the mother" in regards to the necessity of partial birth abortion;

"Partial - birth abortion is never medically necessary to protect the mother's health or her further fertility. In fact,

the procedure can significantly threaten the mother's health or ability to carry future children to term."

He acknowledges that there is no case in which the health of the mother would warrant the need for a partial birth abortion. If you don't take my word or even his, here's what Kate Michelman, head of NARAL (National Abortion and Reproductive Rights Action League) says in last weeks Providence Journal. *"Most women have abortions because they want to be successful mothers."* She was speaking of her own abortion she had in 1970 after her husband left her with three children. She said the abortion was necessary for her *"family's survival."* So even the head of one of the biggest abortion supporters acknowledges that "health of the mother" is not why most women have abortions. If a woman's health was in danger in the last three months when the child is viable, then why not deliver the child C- section? The bottom line is that abortion hurts the mother as well as the child. No partiality! We love both the child and the mother.

Why are we so concerned about showing no partiality and loving both the children and the women? We love them both because Our Lord and Savior hung upon a Cross and died for us ALL! He showed no partiality and died out of love for all of humanity. In fact, he died so that sins may be forgiven. Here, there is also no partiality. **ANY SIN** committed and confessed in the sacrament of confession can be absolved if the penitent is repentant. No partiality! He loves babies in the womb, mothers, fathers, poor, rich, etc.... Jesus has no partiality and died so that we may all have life.

May we go forth and love everyone as Jesus loves, with an unconditional, total, and universal love.

"Si realmente guardas la ley real que se encuentra en las Escrituras, "Ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo", estás haciendo lo correcto. Pero si muestran favoritismo, pecan y son condenados por la ley como transgresores de la ley. Porque cualquiera que guarda toda la ley y, sin embargo, tropieza en un solo punto, es culpable de quebrantarla toda. (Santiago 2:8-10)

Santiago estaba abordando el tema de la no parcialidad hacia los pobres y los ricos. ¿Por qué? El simple hecho, que en Jesús, no hay parcialidad. Tanto los ricos como los pobres están hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios y como tales son creados iguales en su dignidad. Son iguales a los ojos de su Creador. Por eso Santiago les recordaba a los primeros cristianos que no debe haber favoritismo ni parcialidad entre ellos.

Hoy tenemos nuestro propio problema de parcialidad. Quizás no tanto con los pobres y los ricos, pero tenemos un problema en otro ámbito. Ha sido el tema candente en los periódicos, en la televisión, en los debates políticos, etc... El aborto es nuestro problema de parcialidad. Dios ha hecho tanto al bebé en el vientre como a la madre a Su imagen y semejanza y como tales son creados iguales a los ojos de Dios. Sin embargo, escuchamos en nuestros días, una "mujer tiene derecho a elegir". ¿Sabes lo que vamos a decirles a las personas que reclaman eso como un derecho? *¿Qué es lo que eliges?* Necesitamos terminar la oración por ellos. Me encanta elegir entre qué tipo de pasta voy a comer. Sin embargo, si mi elección dañara o incluso matara a otro ser humano inocente, entonces esa elección es incorrecta. Debemos amar a **ambos** tanto al niño como a la madre. ¡Somos pro mujer y pro niño!

También puede escuchar a algunas personas clamando por excepciones. Quizás escuchaste a algunos decir... *"¿Qué pasa con la salud de la madre?"* Permítanme decir primero que la Iglesia enseña que tratamos de salvarlos a ambos. Ella nunca coloca una vida sobre otra. Ella dice que los salve a ambos, pero nunca podemos tomar la vida de uno directamente para salvar al otro. Además, vivimos en una época en que la tecnología moderna es tan grande que este caso es prácticamente inexistente. Tienen procedimientos en los que ahora pueden operar al niño en el útero. No confíe solo en mi palabra sobre esto, esto es lo que dijo el ex cirujano general, C-Everett Koop, sobre la situación de la "vida de la madre" con respecto a la necesidad del aborto por nacimiento parcial. *"Nacimiento parcial, el aborto nunca es médicamente necesario para proteger la salud de la madre o su futura fertilidad. De hecho, el procedimiento puede amenazar significativamente la salud de la madre o la capacidad de tener futuros hijos a término"*. Reconoce que no hay ningún caso en el que la salud de la madre justifique la necesidad de un aborto de nacimiento parcial. Si no lo hace Tome mi palabra o incluso la de él, esto es lo que dice Kate Michelman, directora de NARAL (Liga Nacional de Acción por el Aborto y los Derechos Reproductivos) en las últimas semanas en el Providence Journal: *"La mayoría de las mujeres abortan porque quieren ser madres exitosas"*. El propio aborto que tuvo en 1970 después de que su esposo la dejara con tres hijos dijo que el aborto era necesario para la *"supervivencia de su familia"*. Por lo que incluso el líder de uno de los mayores defensores del aborto reconoce que "la salud de la madre" no es la razón. La mayoría de las mujeres tienen abortos. Si la salud de una mujer estuvo en peligro en los últimos tres meses cuando el niño es viable, entonces ¿por qué no dar a luz al niño por cesárea? La conclusión es que el aborto daña tanto a la madre como al niño. No parcialidad! Amamos tanto al niño como a la madre.

¿Por qué nos preocupa tanto no mostrar parcialidad y amar tanto a los niños como a las mujeres? ¡Los amamos a ambos porque Nuestro Señor y Salvador colgó de una Cruz y murió por TODOS nosotros! No mostró parcialidad y murió por amor a toda la humanidad. De hecho, murió para que los pecados sean perdonados. Aquí tampoco hay parcialidad. CUALQUIER PECADO cometido y confesado en el sacramento de la confesión puede ser absuelto si el penitente está arrepentido. ¡Sin parcialidad! Ama a los niños en el vientre, a las madres, a los padres, a los pobres, a los ricos, etc... Jesús no tiene acepción de personas y murió para que todos tengamos vida. Que salgamos y amemos a todos como Jesús ama, con un amor incondicional, total y universal.






Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Perhaps you or someone you know would like to complete the Sacraments of Initiation (Communion and/or Confirmation). We meet every Wednesday from 7:30pm to 9:30pm starting on October 5th.




Father Roy Tvrdik, MM

Fr. Roy Tvrdik, SMM, was born on Staten Island in 1957 and raised in Port Jefferson, NY. He entered formation with the Montfort Missionaries and graduated from St. John University in 1979. After initial formation, Fr. Roy entered the chaplaincy for Children's Hospital, Washington D.C., for 8 years and sold real estate for several of those years.

He reentered seminary formation at Catholic University and was ordained in 1993. Assigned to St. Mary Gate of Heaven, in Ozone Park, until 1996 where he was made Vocation Director. Throughout his ministry he has given Retreats, Parish Missions, and Preparation for Consecration to Jesus through Mary according to St. Louis de Montfort throughout the United States and taught Theology at St. John University from 2001 to 2005.

Fr. Roy was the Director of the Shrine of Our Lady of the Island, Manorville, NY from 2005 until 2020. There he developed a men's spirituality group called Man Matters. Throughout his time at the Shrine he has conducted weekly theology classes that now continue in four parishes. Currently he facilitates on Cursillo and World Wide Marriage Encounter weekends. He preaches parish missions, leads pilgrimages to the Holy Land and other holy sites throughout the world. He also coordinates Project-Genesis Interfaith since its founding in 2006.

Fr. Roy will preside and preach next weekend at the 5 PM Mass, 7 PM Holy Hour, 7:45 AM and 9 AM.
