#### ...Fr. David Regan

"In every parish of the diocese, a Pastoral Council shall be established, if the diocesan Bishop, after consulting with the Council of Presbyters, so decides. The pastor presides over the Pastoral Council. The Pastoral Council is composed of members of the congregation together with those of the parish staff who have pastoral care by reason of their office. The Pastoral Council assists in promoting pastoral action in the parish."

The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body, pastoral in nature, because it strives to discern the movement of the Holy Spirit among God's people in the parish. A Parish Pastoral Council gives its help to the pastor in fostering pastoral activity; it investigates, under the authority of the pastor, all those things which pertain to pastoral works to ponder them, and to propose practical conclusions about them. It is essential that Council meetings occur in the context of prayer and openness to the Holy Spirit, so that at all times the common good will prevail.

Specifically, the Parish Pastoral Council's purpose is to enhance the process of:

- pastoral planning
- developing pastoral programs
- improving pastoral services
- evaluating the pastoral effectiveness of various programs and services

Although the Council is not a body which makes binding decisions, the recommendations of the Pastoral Council are to be taken seriously when grounded in prayer, discernment and communal wisdom.

The pastor is responsible for the final approval of Council recommendations concerning pastoral planning, programs, and services for the parish, as well as for their implementation. While the pastor is not obliged to follow the recommendations of the Parish Pastoral Council, it is understood that he ought to do so unless there is a compelling reason to do otherwise. If there is such a reason, the pastor should share this with the Council.

The Council does not deal with acts of administration. Acts of administration concern the daily operations of the parish,

which includes the implementation of the pastoral plan and policies, parish programming, budgeting and personnel matters.

Following are some of the pastoral activities which could constitute agenda items for the Parish Pastoral Council:

- -instruction in the full range of the faith and catechetical formation
- -multi-cultural dimensions and challenges
- -programs promoting gospel values, including issues of social justice
- -responsibilities to people with special needs
- -Catholic education of children and young adults
- -outreach to alienated Catholics
- -evangelization
- -programs of sacramental life and preparation
- -promotion of Eucharistic devotion
- -enhancement of programs
- -promotion of prayer life (especially within families)
- -effective participation in the liturgy
- -methods of welcome, home visiting, building community
- -motivation of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy
- -efforts of special care for the sick and dving
- -concern for the poor, the afflicted, the lonely, the exiled
- -fostering of solid Christian family life and all matters of relationships in the parish.

Our Parish Council meets 4-5 times a year. Two weeks prior to a meeting there will be a notice in the bulletin with an email (Of a member). You may write to this person a question, concern, or idea. 



"En cada parroquia de la diócesis, se establecerá un Consejo Pastoral, si el Obispo diocesano, después de consultar con el Consejo de Presbíteros, así lo decide. El párroco preside el Consejo Pastoral. El Consejo Pastoral está compuesto por miembros de la congregación juntos con aquellos del personal parroquial que tienen cuidado pastoral por razón de su cargo. El Consejo Pastoral ayuda a promover la acción pastoral en la parroquia."

El Consejo Pastoral Parroquial es un organismo consultivo, de naturaleza pastoral, porque se esfuerza por discernir el movimiento del Espíritu Santo entre el pueblo de Dios en la parroquia. Un Consejo Pastoral Parroquial presta su ayuda al párroco para fomentar la actividad pastoral; investiga, bajo la autoridad del pastor, todas aquellas cosas que pertenecen a las obras pastorales para reflexionar sobre ellas y proponer conclusiones prácticas sobre ellas. Es esencial que las reuniones del Consejo se realicen en un contexto de oración y apertura al Espíritu Santo, para que en todo momento prevalezca el bien común.

Específicamente, el propósito del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial es mejorar el proceso de:

- -planificación pastoral
- -desarrollar programas pastorales
- -mejorar los servicios pastorales
- -evaluar la eficacia pastoral de diversos programas y servicios

Aunque el Consejo no es un organismo que tome decisiones vinculantes, las recomendaciones del Consejo Pastoral deben tomarse en serio cuando se basan en la oración, el discernimiento y la sabiduría comunitaria.

El párroco es responsable de la aprobación final de las recomendaciones del Consejo relativas a la planificación, programas y servicios pastorales para la parroquia, así como de su implementación. Si bien el párroco no está obligado a seguir las recomendaciones del Consejo Pastoral Parroquial, se entiende que debe hacerlo a menos que exista una razón imperiosa para hacerlo de otra manera. Si existe tal razón, el pastor debe compartirla con el Consejo.

El Consejo no se ocupa de actos de administración. Los actos de administración se refieren a las operaciones diarias de la parroquia, que incluyen la implementación del plan y las políticas pastorales, la programación parroquial, el presupuesto y los asuntos de personal.

A continuación se presentan algunas de las actividades pastorales que podrían constituir puntos de agenda para el Consejo Pastoral Parroquial:

- -instrucción en toda la gama de la fe y catequesis formación
- -dimensiones y desafíos multiculturales
- -programas que promuevan los valores del evangelio, incluyendo temas de justicia social
- -responsabilidades hacia personas con necesidades especiales
- -Educación católica de niños y jóvenes.
- -alcance a los católicos alienados
- -evangelización
- -programas de vida sacramental y preparación
- -promoción de la devoción eucarística
- -mejora de programas
- -promoción de la vida de oración (especialmente en el seno de las familias)
- -participación efectiva en la liturgia
- -métodos de acogida, visitas domiciliarias, construcción de comunidad -motivación de las obras de misericordia espirituales y corporales
- -esfuerzos de atención especial a los enfermos y moribundos
- -preocupación por los pobres, los afligidos, los solitarios, los exiliados



### Finding time for powerful prayer

If you struggle to find time to pray, try these three tips: **Prioritize.** Much unseen good depends on prayer, and it's as critical to our souls as breathing is to the body. Jesus corrected St. Martha because she lost sight of "the one thing... needful" (Luke 10:41-42). Reserve time for daily prayer. Treat it as an important appointment – because it is. **Set boundaries.** Jesus dismissed the crowd in the evening and "went up into the hills to pray" (Matthew 14:23). Give

God your undivided attention in prayer for whatever time you can. Be fully present, minimizing distractions. Let the world wait while you spend time with the One who loves you most.

Activate your work. Few of us have the luxury of being able to spend all day in prayer but we can make a morning offering, giving our day to God's service. Entrust all the events, tasks, and concerns of the day to God's mercy and providence. This way, our work is made holy and can help bring souls to Christ.



#### Matthew 20:1-16a, The generous landowner

In this Gospel reading, Jesus told a parable in which He compared God's kingdom to a vineyard in the charge of a generous landlord. In the parable, the landlord hires groups of workers at various times of the day. All agree with the landlord to work for a "fair wage." The vineyard is God's kingdom and God is the generous landlord. Some Bible scholars propose that the earlier groups of workers represented the Jewish people, who had followed God's laws for thousands of years, while the Gentiles were the latecomers. The workers also stood for those whom God calls at various stages of life: from infancy, adolescence, adulthood, and old age. Then the landlord paid the laborers, beginning with the five o'clock workers. It must have shocked Jesus' listeners to hear that the landlord paid those who worked one hour as if they'd worked for twelve hours. Clearly, God's idea of a "fair" wage is not the same as ours. What is important is not how many hours we've served God, but if we answered Him when He called us.

#### **FEASTS & CELEBRATIONS**

**September 1 – St. Giles (710).** Shrouded in mystery, St. Giles was a hermit who lived near the Rhône River in France. His fame as a miracle worker drew crowds and disciples to him. Eventually, St. Giles became abbot of a monastery.

**September 8 – Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** Mary's birth brought her parents joy, and we are joyful too – because Mary brings salvation to all of us with the birth of Jesus.

September 14 - The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (c.326). St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, discovered what is believed to be the Cross of Christ while on pilgrimage in Jerusalem. Constantine built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on the site.

September 28 – St. Wenceslaus (929). Raised by his devout grandmother, St. Ludmilla, "The Good King" St. Wenceslaus worked to end Christian persecution in Bohemia, encouraged German missionaries, built churches, and cared for the sick and poor. He was martyred by a group of dissatisfied nobles, led by his brother, Boleslaus.

# What's the proper way to show reverence before I receive Communion?

In days past, everyone approached the altar, knelt at the altar rail and received the host on our tongues. That was prescribed as a posture of reverence to show respect and adoration for the Body and Blood of our Lord.

The bishops in the United States have decided that we may approach the altar and stand to receive Communion. When we approach, we are to bow as a gesture of reverence before we receive the consecrated host from the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion.

Today we can receive the host either on the tongue or in the hand. To receive in the hand, we place one hand, palm up, on top of the other to form a "throne." We can also receive Holy Communion in the form of precious Blood. When Holy Communion is offered under both kinds we repeat the bow of our heads before receiving each one.

Genuflection is appropriate at other times. For example, we genuflect before the tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament.

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
