A Note from the Pastor*Fr. Jeff Yildirmaz*

Blessed be the Holy Name of Mary!

Last week I wrote about confession. Allow me this time to write about what is paired with confession at our parish, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Adoration is a great time of quiet prayer in which we can rest in Jesus. Jesus is with us in the Most Holy Eucharist in the Consecrated Host. It is time always well spent. Even if only a few minutes of prayer is offered to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, it still counts and it is time pleasing to God.

There is no exact set time limit when it comes to Adoration. Many people choose to pray for a full hour. This is known as a holy hour. This devotion which comes from the tradition of Jesus's request from the apostles to keep watch with him in prayer for an hour on Holy Thursday night at the Mount of Olives. Some choose to stay even longer. Others only come for a half hour or less.

I would recommend for starters to try to give at least 15 minutes in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. You could start for the first 5 minutes by offering thanks for all the blessings he has given you throughout your life. This could easily take more than 5 minutes.

The next part is to offer Jesus certain petitions that come from your heart. This may be a bit difficult. It may be hard to talk about this. At a certain point it makes us vulnerable by asking Jesus to help us with certain things.

Next, try to take a minute or two and simply be with Jesus. Know that you are in his loving presence. As you are looking at Him in the Host, He is looking at you with His absolute love.

The last step is to ask Jesus for his mercy. This is fitting to end our prayer with this. Asking Jesus for his mercy is something that the Church continuously does. It is at the heart of the Holy Mass from beginning to the end, the mercy of God is consistently being invoked.

As you know, there are plenty of opportunities to go to Adoration. Consider making some time and simply be with Jesus.

Proposal 1: A Wolf in Sheep's Clothing

Below is a statement from Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York; Most Rev. Edward B. Scharfenberger, Bishop of Albany; Most Rev. Robert J. Brennan, Bishop of Brooklyn; Most Rev. Michael W. Fisher, Bishop of Buffalo; Most Rev. Terry R. LaValley, Bishop of Ogdensburg; Most Reverend Salvatore R. Matano, Bishop of Rochester; Most Rev. John O. Barres, Bishop of Rockville Centre; Bishop Douglas J. Lucia, Bishop of Syracuse; and the auxiliary and emeritus Bishops of New York State.

On November 5, faithful citizens throughout the nation will have the opportunity once again to exercise their sacred right to vote. Pope Francis has reminded us that as thoughtful Catholics, we must participate in the public square for the sake of the common good. Every Catholic is called to do the work of properly informing his or her conscience and voting for candidates and policies that will best advance the natural law, the protection of human rights, the dignity of the human person, the sacredness of all life, and the teachings of Christ and His Church. It is a presidential election year, and there are important votes to be cast for Congress and the state Legislature as well. Importantly, in New York, like several other states, there is also a critical referendum on the ballot.

Educating oneself will be especially important in the case of **Proposal 1**, sometimes referred to as the “Equal Rights Amendment.” The title suggests a noble cause, as all children of God should be treated equally under the law. However, this proposed amendment to the state Constitution is broadly written and could have dangerous consequences if enacted, which is why we oppose it and urge you to vote no. The measure would, effectively, permanently legalize abortion without restriction and up until the moment of birth in New York. Aside from being redundant in a state that already has stripped away all abortion limitations, the amendment would render impossible any change to the law if the hearts and minds of New Yorkers were ever to shift toward protecting the child in the womb.

The amendment’s sweeping language and inclusion of “age” as a protected class could also lead to parents’ rights being stripped away. Courts could decide that parents have no authority over their minor children on important matters and permit children to make destructive and permanent decisions on their own which they could well live to regret, including but not limited to so-called “gender affirming” treatments and surgeries. The relationship between parents and their children is sacred. Parents must be able to support and guide their children in accord with the natural law, without interference from the government or courts, which would be reaching beyond their competency.

Proposal 1 is a wolf in sheep’s clothing that could lead to darkness for many New York families. This amendment disregards the lives of unborn and struggling children in the name of political agendas. It could have dangerous consequences for these children and their parents. As they look to make their voices heard in the public square, faithful Catholics should consider these consequences and **Vote ‘NO’**. Likewise, they should thoughtfully vote their informed conscience up and down the ballot so that we might usher in change for good.

¡Bendito sea el Santo Nombre de María!

La semana pasada escribí sobre la confesión. Permítanme esta vez escribir sobre lo que se combina con la confesión en nuestra parroquia: la Adoración al Santísimo Sacramento.

La adoración es un gran momento de oración silenciosa en el que podemos descansar en Jesús. Jesús está con nosotros en la Santísima Eucaristía en la Hostia Consagrada. Es un tiempo siempre bien empleado. Incluso si solo se ofrecen unos pocos minutos de oración a Jesús en el Santísimo Sacramento, aún cuenta y es un tiempo agradable a Dios.

No hay un límite de tiempo exacto establecido cuando se trata de la adoración. Muchas personas eligen orar durante una hora completa. Esto se conoce como hora santa. Esta devoción proviene de la tradición de la petición de Jesús a los apóstoles de permanecer con él en oración durante una hora la noche del Jueves Santo en el Monte de los Olivos. Algunos eligen quedarse incluso más tiempo. Otros solo vienen durante media hora o menos.

Recomendaría a los principiantes que intenten dedicar al menos 15 minutos a la oración ante el Santísimo Sacramento. Puedes comenzar los primeros 5 minutos ofreciendo gracias por todas las bendiciones que te ha dado a lo largo de tu vida. Esto podría fácilmente tomar más de 5 minutos.

La siguiente parte es ofrecerle a Jesús ciertas peticiones que vienen de tu corazón. Esto puede ser un poco difícil. Puede ser difícil hablar de esto. En cierto punto nos hace vulnerables pedirle a Jesús que nos ayude con ciertas cosas.

Luego, intenta tomarte un minuto o dos y simplemente estar con Jesús. Debes saber que estás en su presencia amorosa. Mientras lo miras en la Hostia, Él te está mirando con Su amor absoluto.

El último paso es pedirle a Jesús su misericordia. Es apropiado terminar nuestra oración con esto. Pedirle a Jesús su misericordia es algo que la Iglesia hace continuamente. Está en el corazón de la Santa Misa desde el principio hasta el final, la misericordia de Dios se invoca constantemente.

Como sabes, hay muchas oportunidades para ir a la Adoración. Considera tomarte un tiempo y simplemente estar con Jesús.

Propuesta 1: Un lobo con piel de oveja

Declaración de los Obispos Católicos del Estado de Nueva York

El 5 de noviembre, los fieles ciudadanos de toda la nación tendrán una vez más la oportunidad de ejercer su sagrado derecho al voto. El Papa Francisco nos ha recordado que, como católicos de buen juicio, tenemos la obligación de participar en el ámbito de la opinión pública en beneficio del bien común. Cada católico está llamado a tomarse el trabajo de informar adecuadamente a su conciencia y votar por los candidatos y las políticas que mejor promuevan la ley natural, la protección de los derechos humanos, la dignidad de la persona humana, el carácter sagrado de toda vida y las enseñanzas de Cristo y su Iglesia. Es un año de elecciones presidenciales y además hay votaciones importantes para el Congreso y la Legislatura estatal. Cabe mencionar que en Nueva York, al igual que en otros estados, también hay un referéndum decisivo en las urnas.

Instruirse será especialmente importante en el caso de la Propuesta 1, en ocasiones denominada "Enmienda de Igualdad de Derechos". El título sugiere una causa noble, ya que todos los hijos de Dios deben recibir el mismo trato ante la ley. Sin embargo, esta propuesta de enmienda a la Constitución estatal está redactada en términos generales y podría tener consecuencias peligrosas si se promulga, por lo que nos oponemos a ella y les instamos a votar en contra. La medida, en efecto, legalizaría permanentemente el aborto sin restricciones y hasta el momento del nacimiento en Nueva York. Además de ser redundante en un estado que ya ha eliminado todas las restricciones al aborto, la enmienda haría imposible cualquier cambio en la ley si los corazones y las mentes de los neoyorquinos cambiaran alguna vez hacia la protección del niño en el vientre materno.

El lenguaje amplio de la enmienda y la inclusión de la "edad" como clase protegida también podrían llevar a que se despojara a los padres de sus derechos. Los tribunales podrían decidir que los padres no tienen autoridad sobre sus hijos menores en asuntos importantes y permitir que los niños tomen por su cuenta decisiones destructivas y permanentes de las que podrían llegar a arrepentirse, incluidos, entre otros, los llamados tratamientos y cirugías de "afirmación de género". La relación entre padres e hijos es sagrada. Los padres deben ser capaces de apoyar y guiar a sus hijos de acuerdo con la ley natural, sin interferencias del gobierno o de los tribunales, que irían más allá de sus competencias.

La Propuesta 1 es un lobo con piel de oveja que podría llevar a la oscuridad a muchas familias neoyorquinas. Esta enmienda ignora la vida de los niños no nacidos y en dificultades en nombre de agendas políticas. Podría tener consecuencias peligrosas para estos niños y sus padres. A la hora de hacer oír sus voces en el ámbito de la opinión pública, los fieles católicos deberían considerar estas consecuencias y manifestar su voto en contra. Del mismo modo, deberían votar con buen juicio y su conciencia bien informada en las urnas para que podamos introducir un cambio positivo.
