DID YOU KNOW?

You may know Thanksgiving is a day full of gratitude, turkeys and loved ones—but how many Thanksgiving facts do you really know? Here are a few interesting ones according to Readers Digest. Happy Thanksgiving!

Data from the US Poultry and Egg Association, Americans consume more than 45 million turkeys on Thanksgiving. According to the US Calorie Control Council, an average American may consume a whopping 4,500 calories and 229 grams of fat on Thanksgiving Day. The recommended daily caloric intake for an average person is 2,000 per day! A typical adult needs to spend 10 hours at a steady pace on a treadmill to burn off an average Thanksgiving meal.

It takes an average of 9.6 hours for a host to prepare a full Thanksgiving meal. How much time is spent eating that meal? 16 minutes.

There are three towns in the United States named "Turkey." They can be found in Texas, Louisiana, and North Carolina.

Around 50 million pumpkin pies are consumed every Thanksgiving, even though opinion polls show that America's favorite pie is apple.

If you've got a question about your Thanksgiving turkey, the Butterball Turkey Hotline is at your service. Each year, Butterball's experts take over 100,000 calls about turkey preparation during November and December.

The TV dinner was born from Thanksgiving leftovers. Specifically, a worker at Swanson ordered excess frozen turkeys on the Thanksgiving Day of 1953. The company's salesman suggested packaging the leftover turkeys in aluminum trays as well as cornbread dressing, sweet potatoes, and peas.

The plastic piece or wire that holds the turkey legs together is called a "hock lock."

The Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade balloons are huge, and there are rules in place that prevent them from getting any larger. In 1997, the balloons went haywire on a particularly windy holiday. The Barney balloon tore along its middle. Police had to stab the Pink Panther to regain control of it. And the Cat in the Hat struck a lamppost at 72nd Street, bringing the balloon down. After these events, parade organizers came up with a size regulation: Balloons can't be larger than 70 feet high, 78 feet long and 40 feet wide.

Nothing satisfies quite like Thanksgiving leftovers. According to a 2024 survey by Jennie-O, 96% of Americans agree leftovers are the best part of the Thanksgiving meal. Who can resist that next-day turkey sandwich or a second helping of stuffing?
