Blessed be the Holy Name of Mary!

I hope you have had a restful and peaceful Thanksgiving. A new Church year has come. Thus, we have arrived at the season of Advent!

Jesus did not first appear to us as someone who is mighty, immortal, and all powerful although He possessed these qualities as True God. He came to us as a little child.

By preparing for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, let us perhaps consider orienting ourselves in having a childlike spirit. Jesus Himself came to us completely vulnerable and dependent upon the care of Joseph and the Blessed Mother.

We too can have that same disposition. None of us are self-made. From the very beginning of our existence until our death, we are dependent upon others. Most importantly, it is the Lord who truly provides for our needs, and gives us the gift of life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: To become a child in relation to God is the condition for entering the kingdom. For this, we must humble ourselves and become little. Even more: to become “children of God” we must be “born from above” or “born of God” (526).

To become little, we must let go of what is holding us back from God. During the season of Advent, there will plenty of opportunities to take part in the Sacrament of Penance especially on Christmas Eve. I am calling it the *Holy Name of Mary Christmas Eve Special!*

One thing that I know for sure is that I am not perfect nor am I in control of everything. I would think this would also apply to you as well. It may seem that our circumstances or burdens in life control us, that is not true. Jesus wants us to offer everything to Him: the good, the bad and the ugly. It is Jesus who is in control. And yes, He is perfect.

Lastly, to be little, we must embrace the Truth: that we are always under the care of the One True God: The Most Holy Trinity. For God So loved the world that He gave us His only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16).

On behalf of the priests, please know of our prayers for you and your loved ones during the Season of Advent. God bless you.

Espero que hayan tenido un día de Acción de Gracias tranquilo y lleno de paz. Ha llegado un nuevo año eclesialístico. Por lo tanto, ¡hemos llegado a la época de Adviento!

Jesús no se nos apareció primero como alguien poderoso, inmortal y todopoderoso, aunque poseía estas cualidades como Dios Verdadero. Vino a nosotros como un niño pequeño.

Al prepararnos para el nacimiento de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, consideremos tal vez orientarnos para tener un espíritu infantil. Jesús mismo vino a nosotros completamente vulnerable y dependiente del cuidado de José y la Santísima Madre.

Nosotros también podemos tener esa misma disposición. Ninguno de nosotros se hace a sí mismo. Desde el comienzo mismo de nuestra existencia hasta nuestra muerte, dependemos de los demás. Lo más importante es que es el Señor quien verdaderamente provee para nuestras necesidades y nos da el don de la vida.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica afirma: Convertirse en un niño en relación con Dios es la condición para entrar en el reino. Para esto, debemos humillarnos y hacernos pequeños. Más aún: para llegar a ser “hijos de Dios” debemos “nacer de lo alto” o “nacer de Dios” (526).

Para llegar a ser pequeños, debemos desprendernos de lo que nos impide acercarnos a Dios. Durante el tiempo de Adviento, habrá muchas oportunidades de participar en el Sacramento de la Penitencia, especialmente en la Nochebuena. ¡Lo llamo el Especial de Nochebuena del Santo Nombre de María!

Una cosa que sé con certeza es que no soy perfecto ni tengo el control de todo. Creo que esto también se aplica a ti. Puede parecer que nuestras circunstancias o cargas en la vida nos controlan, eso no es cierto. Jesús quiere que le ofrezcamos todo: lo bueno, lo malo y lo feo. Es Jesús quien tiene el control. Y sí, Él es perfecto.

Por último, para ser pequeños, debemos abrazar la Verdad: que siempre estamos bajo el cuidado del Único Dios Verdadero: La Santísima Trinidad. Porque de tal manera amó Dios al mundo, que nos dio a su Hijo único, para que todo aquel que en él cree, no se pierda, mas tenga vida eterna (Juan 3:16).
