Blessed be the Holy Name of Mary!

The Last Sunday of Christmas is the Baptism of the Lord. Next week will be the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. Can you believe it? I will admit the Season of Ordinary Time does not seem to be the most marketable name out there. Yet, it is a reminder that Jesus is with us not only during the most solemn days of the year such as Christmas, Easter but every single day of our lives.

During Christmas we meditate upon the birth of Jesus and during Easter we focus on the resurrection of Christ. For Ordinary Time, we orient ourselves to the entire life of Jesus. Praying the Rosary is a wonderful way of instilling this practice. It fittingly begins with the Annunciation of the Lord and concludes with the Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Although it may seem ordinary, grace is always extraordinary. Jesus is always active in our life whether we realize it or not. God's grace is always at work in us. Although we rest and sleep, God never does. He continuously pours out his love for us. The very reason why you are here in this church reading this letter is a testament to God's encompassing grace. It is the same reason why someone goes to confession, turns away from vice, and draws oneself closer to God.

Jesus is with us while we work, do errands, rest, and most especially during times of great trial. I say, especially, because it is in those periods of our life that we realize how much we need Jesus. Although it is Ordinary Time, it is not ordinary grace. Allow me to end this letter from the last words of Georges Bernanos's novel, *Diary of a Country Priest*, "Does it matter? All is grace."

Join the Diocese of RVC for a historic occasion as we celebrate our Eucharistic Congress on Pentecost Sunday, 2025, at St. Anthony's High School. Prepare your hearts by learning about the Eucharist, encountering Christ in Adoration, and joining in our Eucharistic Pilgrimages from May 31-June 8.



Beginning on May 31, 2025, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, two nine-day Eucharistic Pilgrimages will embark across Long Island, both culminating at St. Anthony's High School on Sunday, June 8, 2025, for the celebration of our local Diocesan Eucharistic Congress. The Western Route will journey from St. Agnes Cathedral (Rockville Centre) through Nassau County, while the Eastern Route will journey from the Parish of St. Therese of Lisieux (Montauk) through Suffolk County.

The Holy Eucharist will be carried in procession across the Diocese through many of our towns, schools, hospitals, cemeteries and parishes. During this pilgrimage, there will be opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic Catechesis, Praise and Worship, public processions, and other Eucharistic celebrations. The People of God will be invited to walk with Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, pray in the pilgrim churches and proclaim the Gospel to bystanders as Jesus passes through their towns.

**PERPETUAL PILGRIMS.** The diocese is inviting a dedicated group of young adults, (18-29), to apply to be *Perpetual Pilgrims*. These Perpetual Pilgrims will make the entire 9 day journey with the Lord in the Eucharist across the Diocese from May 31-June 7, along with priest chaplains and an official pilgrimage team. These pilgrims will represent the many young people from across LI who are on fire with Eucharistic love and missionary fervor. Applicants should be in good physical condition, capable of walking long distances, and committed to Christ, the teachings of His Church, and ongoing intellectual and spiritual formation.

Applications for Perpetual Pilgrims are now available through February 2, 2025.

El último domingo de Navidad es el Bautismo del Señor. La semana que viene será el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. ¿Puedes creerlo? Admito que el Tiempo Ordinario no parece ser el nombre más comercial que existe. Sin embargo, es un recordatorio de que Jesús está con nosotros no solo durante los días más solemnes del año, como Navidad y Pascua, sino todos los días de nuestra vida.

Durante la Navidad meditamos sobre el nacimiento de Jesús y durante la Pascua nos centramos en la resurrección de Cristo. En el Tiempo Ordinario, nos orientamos hacia la vida completa de Jesús. ## **¡Mira...Tu Rey viene a ti!**

A partir del 31 de mayo de 2025, festividad de la Visitación de la Santísima Virgen María, se realizarán dos peregrinaciones eucarísticas de nueve días por Long Island, ambas culminando en la escuela secundaria St. Anthony el domingo 8 de junio de 2025, para la celebración de nuestro Congreso Eucarístico Diocesano local. La ruta occidental viajará desde la catedral de Santa Inés (Rockville Centre) a través del condado de Nassau, mientras que la ruta oriental viajará desde la parroquia de Santa Teresa de Lisieux (Montauk) a través del condado de Suffolk.

La Sagrada Eucaristía se llevará en procesión por toda la Diócesis a través de muchos de nuestros pueblos, escuelas, hospitales, cementerios y parroquias. Durante esta peregrinación, habrá oportunidades para la Adoración Eucarística, la celebración de la Misa, la Catequesis Eucarística, la Alabanza y el Culto, las procesiones públicas y otras celebraciones eucarísticas. El Pueblo de Dios será invitado a caminar con Jesús, verdaderamente presente en la Sagrada Eucaristía, a orar en las iglesias de peregrinación y a proclamar el Evangelio a los transeúntes mientras Jesús pasa por sus pueblos.

**PEREGRINOS PERPETUOS.** La diócesis está invitando a un grupo dedicado de jóvenes adultos (de 18 a 29 años) a postularse para ser Peregrinos Perpetuos. Estos Peregrinos Perpetuos harán el viaje de 9 días con el Señor en la Eucaristía por toda la Diócesis del 31 de mayo al 7 de junio, junto con sacerdotes capellanes y un equipo oficial de peregrinación. Estos peregrinos representarán a los muchos jóvenes de todo Long Island que están encendidos por el amor eucarístico y el fervor misionero. Los solicitantes deben estar en buenas condiciones físicas, ser capaces de caminar largas distancias y estar comprometidos con Cristo, las enseñanzas de Su Iglesia y la formación intelectual y espiritual continua.
