## Blessed be the Holy Name of Mary!

You may have asked the question leading up to Lent, what can I do for Jesus? Perhaps, one could ask this question: How can I spend time with Jesus? This may seem to be an odd question. But this is really the heart of prayer: spending time with God.

One of the great ways to spend time with Jesus is through prayerfully reading the Bible, especially the Gospels. If there is a part of the Gospels that I would encourage you to read during the Lent, it would be the passion narratives. My personal favorite is from the Gospel of John. Furthermore, the passion narrative of the Gospel of John is what is proclaimed during the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday.

I would recommend reading about 5 minutes and spend the next 5 minutes in silent prayer. We believe as Christians that Sacred Scripture (the Bible) is the Living Word of God in which God speaks to us. Try not to read it as you would a novel by reading as much as you can. Rather prayerfully let it seep. Read the same passage for a second or even a third time, to become more assimilated to the passage.

If you have a very acute memory, try to remember certain words that draw you in. If you want to challenge yourself, memorize an entire passage. It is a good way to stimulate your mind.


If I may suggest carefully and prayerfully, read the words of Jesus in the entirety of the passion narratives. They truly are beautiful synthesis of His teaching and His love.

Let us keep praying for the peace and recovery of the Holy Father, Pope Francis. Last Thursday, March 13, marked his twelve-year anniversary as Pope.







¡Bendito sea el Santo Nombre de María!

Quizás te hayas preguntado antes de la Cuaresma: "¿Qué puedo hacer por Jesús?". Quizás podrías preguntarte: "¿Cómo puedo pasar tiempo con Jesús?". Puede parecer una pregunta extraña, pero en realidad es la esencia de la oración: pasar tiempo con Dios.

Una de las mejores maneras de pasar tiempo con Jesús es leyendo la Biblia con oración, especialmente los Evangelios. Si hay una parte de los Evangelios que te animo a leer durante la Cuaresma, son los relatos de la Pasión. Mi favorito es el Evangelio de Juan. Además, el relato de la Pasión del Evangelio de Juan es lo que se proclama durante la Liturgia de la Pasión del Señor el Viernes Santo.

Recomiendo leer unos 5 minutos y dedicar los siguientes 5 minutos a la oración en silencio. Como cristianos, creemos que la Sagrada Escritura (la Biblia) es la Palabra Viva de Dios, en la que Dios nos habla. Intenta no leerla como si fuera una novela, lee todo lo que puedas. Más bien, déjate llevar por la oración. Lee el mismo pasaje una segunda o incluso una tercera vez para asimilarlo mejor.

Si tienes una memoria muy aguda, intenta recordar ciertas palabras que te llamen la atención. Si quieres desafiarte, memoriza un pasaje completo. Es una buena manera de estimular tu mente.

Si me permites sugerirte que leas con atención y oración las palabras de Jesús en su totalidad en los relatos de la Pasión. Son una hermosa síntesis de su enseñanza y su amor.

Sigamos orando por la paz y la recuperación del Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco. El jueves pasado, 13 de marzo, se cumplieron doce años de su pontificado.
