October is Respect for Life Month. During the month of October, I will write to you about the teaching of the Church regarding the gift of human life. In addition, I will include how certain disordered rights have become legal in our country and violate this precious gift from God.

To begin, the moral teachings of the Catholic Church is an extension of the eternal law of God. Our participation in this moral understanding through our faith and reason that is rooted in God is natural law. Without these two understandings the Church has no basis of its moral teachings. Tragically, our culture has completely taken God out of the picture and absolute truths have been replaced with moral relativism. With relativism, you now have an increase of, which I dare say, "disordered rights" that are a rejection of God's moral law. What we have today is what St. John Paul II famously declared a 'culture of death."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that the dignity of the human person is rooted in his creation in the image and likeness of God... Endowed with a 'spiritual and immortal' soul, the human person is the only creature on earth that God has willed for his own sake. From his conception, he is destined for eternal beatitude, CCC 1700, 1703.


This dignity is given from God to the person not because the person has done any work of action but simply because the human person exists, born or unborn. What a marvelous and beautiful way to look at our humanity.

Therefore, it is our responsibility to respect, safeguard, and nurture the human person in all stages of human life from conception to natural death.





This week we celebrate the Angels & Saints



St. Jerome (Sept 30)

- Before he was known as St. Jerome, he was named Eusebius Sophronius Hieronymus.
- He is best known for translating the Bible from Greek and Hebrew into Latin, known as the Vulgate, which became the standard version of the Bible in the Middle Ages.
- He is the Patron Saint of librarians, scholars, students and abandoned children.
- Jerome is recognized as a Doctor of the Church and is regarded as one of the most learned of the Latin fathers.

St. Therese of the Child Jesus (October 1)

- St. Therese was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II. She is only the third woman to be so proclaimed, (and the youngest) after Saint Catherine of Siena and Saint Teresa of Avila.
- ◆ The "Little Way" of St. Therese is a message of spirituality that focuses on childlike trust in Jesus.
- ◆ St. Therese died at the age of 24. Her final words were, "My God, I love you!"
- Her deathbed promise is to "send down a shower of roses from the heavens" for those who asked for her intercession.

The Holy Guardian Angels (October 2)

- Guardian angels are spiritual beings assigned by God to protect and guide every human person throughout their life.
- ◆ These angels are not only personal protectors but are also believed to watch nations, cities, parishes.
- Guardian angels serve as constant companions, offering guidance and intercession from birth to death.
- Guardian angels have names, but God gives those names to them. The practice of assigning names to the Holy Angels should be discouraged, except in the cases of Gabriel, Raphael and Michael whose names are contained in Holy Scripture."

St. Francis of Assisi (October 4)

- Saint Francis abandoned a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty.
- Francis reportedly received a vision that left him with the stigmata of Christ — marks resembling the wounds Jesus Christ suffered when he was crucified — making Francis the first person to receive such holy wounds.
- He developed a deep love of nature and animals and is known as the patron saint of the environment and animals. He was canonized as a saint only 2 years after his death.
