The Diocese Rockville Centre is now part of Reconciliation Monday, December 22, across the New York Area. Confessions will be available at all parishes within the Dioceses of Rockville Centre, Brooklyn, and the Archdiocese of New York from 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM- 9:00 PM on this day. That is a lot of parishes and a lot of confessions! If you are going to go to the confession that day, call the parish earlier just to be certain that it will be offered on those times. Some parishes may adjust their schedule due to a shortage of priests. Holy Name of Mary Parish will offer it from 2:00 PM - 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM- 9:00 PM.

In addition, the Sacrament of Penance will be offered on Christmas Eve from 12:00 PM – 3:00 PM at Holy Name of Mary Parish. That is eight hours of extra availably for confessions during Christmas week!

Receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent is an excellent way to prepare for the Christmas season. The greatest gift you can receive from Jesus is His mercy. And the greatest gift you can give Him is to confess your sins with contrition.

Although going to confession is not easy, it is one of the greatest spiritual practices you can do. It may be the case, that you haven't gone in years or even decades, I implore you to please confess. You will make Jesus, the Blessed Mother, and your pastor very happy if you go.

If you are reluctant to go to confession for any reason, just tell the priest at Holy Name of Mary that you are a <u>friend of the Blessed Mother</u> and he will make it as easy as possible for you.

### **Get to know the Advent Saints**

St. Juan Diego-Dec. 9. In 1531, the Virgin Mary appeared to Juan as he passed Tepeyac Hill. She said that she wanted a church to be built on that site. Juan needed proof to bring to the bishop. On the snow-covered hill, Juan found beautiful roses, a kind that did not grow in Mexico. Juan filled his cloak with the flowers and ran to see the bishop. When he opened his cloak the flowers fell to the floor. To their amazement, an image of the Lady was imprinted inside Juan's cloak. Soon after, the bishop had a church built on the site where the Virgin Mary first appeared to Juan.

Our Lady of Loreto-Dec. 10. The title Our Lady of Loreto is associated with the Holy House of Loreto in Italy. The house believed to have been miraculously transported from Nazareth to Europe by angels. St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, built a basilica over the house. In 1090, the basilica was destroyed but the house remained intact. Another basilica was built, and it was again destroyed, but the Holy House was intact. Today a great basilica contains the house of the Holy Family. Above the altar inside the Holy House is an ancient statue of Our Lady holding the Infant Jesus. The statue is the origin of the title Our Lady of Loreto. Pope Francis added this feast in 2019.

**Our Lady of Guadalupe-Dec. 12.** Mary is the Patron Saint of Mexico and Patroness of the Americas. The day commemorates her apparition to St. Juan Diego in the hills of Tepeyac. She asked him to go to the bishop and tell him that the Ever Virgin Mary, Mother of God, sent him to ask for a church to be built atop Tepeyac hill.

**St. Lucy-Dec. 13.** St. Lucy made a vow of virginity and distributed her wealth to the poor. This generosity stirred the wrath of the unworthy youth to whom she had been unwillingly betrothed and who denounced her to the governor of Sicily. After torture which included taking out her eyes, a fire was then built around her, but God protected her. She was finally put to death by the sword. Her name appears in the second list in the Roman Eucharist Canon.







The story of La Virgen de la Puerta began in the 17th century, when the image was placed at the entrance of the town to protect it from a feared pirate attack after neighboring cities were plundered. The story of La Virgen de la Puerta begins with the pirate attack on the city of Guayaquil, Ecuador.

As the pirates were heading to the Port of Huanchaco, towards Otuzco Peru, the townspeople took out the image of the Immaculate Conception in a procession for three days, praying the Holy Rosary. Fearing looting and the violation of women, the entire town prayed, asking the Blessed Mother to protect them from the approaching attack.

When the townspeople saw the pirates near the port, they began to hide the women, children, and elderly. With no way to defend themselves, they decided to place the image of the Immaculate Conception in front of the port, with all the men standing around the Virgin. Suddenly, a thick fog covered them, and everyone fell into a deep sleep.

When they awoke, they did not know what had happened. As the fog drifted away, they saw the pirates retreating. The Blessed Mother protected them! From that moment on, they called her La Inmaculada Conception Virgen de la Puerta (Immaculate Conception – Virgin of the Gate) because she protected the town.

Since then, La Virgen de la Puerta has been crowned as: "Universal Queen of Peace" by Pope Pius XII in 1943. "Mother of Mercy" by Pope Francis in 2018. Today, Otuzco, Peru is called the capital of "Faith" because the villagers always trusted the Lord, and the Blessed Mother would protect them.

La Historia de la Virgen de la Puerta, se originó en el siglo XVII, cuando la imagen fue colocada en la entrada de la ciudad para protegerla ante el ataques de los piratas. La historia de la Virgen, empieza con el ataque de los Piratas en la ciudad de Guayaquil, Ecuador; Y se dirigian al Peru, al Puerto de Huanchaco Otuzco -Peru.

Ante el temor del saqueo, y violacion de las mujeres los ciudadanos sacaron a la \* INMACULADA CONCEPCIÓN\* en procesión por 3 dias y rezando el "Santo Rosario".

Todo el pueblo oraban pidiendo a la madre que los protejieran ante aquel ataque que se aproximaba. Cuando vieron a los piratas cerca del puerto, los pobladores empezaron a esconder a las mujeres, niños y ancianos, era miedo y dolor el llanto de las mujeres. No tenían como defenderse y optaron por colocar a la imagen de la Inmaculada Concepción al frente del Puerto, y todos los hombres alrededor de la Virgen; Y de pronto una neblina densa se apodero de ellos y todos quedaron profundamente dormidos. Cuando despertaron no sabian que habia pasado, cuando la neblina se fue alejando vieron que los Piratas se iban de retirada. Desde ese momento la llamaron \*INMACULADA CONCEPCIÓN VIRGEN DE LA PUERTA\*-PUERTA-. POR QUE PROTEGIO EL PUEBLO. FUE CORONADA 2 VECES: 1943, PAPA PIO XII, la corono como "REINA UNIVERSAL DE LA PAZ." 2018 PAPA FRANCISCO, la corono como "MADRE DE LA MISERICORDIA". Hoy en día Otuzco Trujillo-PERU La llaman capital de la "fe" porque nunca la perdieron, confiaron en el señor y en la virgen que los iban a proteger y no dejarlos solos.
