

At the Procession with Palms – Gospel *Matthew 21:1-11*

When Jesus and the disciples drew near Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tethered, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them here to me. And if anyone should say anything to you, reply, 'The master has need of them.' Then he will send them at once."

This happened so that what had been spoken through the prophet might be fulfilled: *Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king comes to you, meek and riding on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."* The disciples went and did as Jesus had ordered them. They brought the ass and the colt and laid their cloaks over them, and he sat upon them.

The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest."

And when he entered Jerusalem the whole city was shaken and asked, "Who is this?"

And the crowds replied, "This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee."

A Note from the Pastor

Blessed be the Holy Name of Mary!

“Who is this?” And the crowds replied, ‘This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee.’ This passage is taken from the first Gospel of today’s Mass. Many of Jesus’ disciples were there with Him as He processed in His entrance to Jerusalem. Less than a week later, far fewer of his disciples were there in the same area on Good Friday. Who is Jesus to us? And how will we respond to His supreme sacrifice on Good Friday and in His resurrection on Easter Sunday?

We have arrived at Holy Week. Palm Sunday has come! Hearing the Passion narrative from the Gospel of Matthew should lead us to repentance. Jesus died on the Cross for us as sinners. In the sacrament of penance, Jesus invites those who are truly repentant to receive His absolute mercy.

In Holy Week, the faithful have so many opportunities to make a good confession. There is no other week in the church year that has more times for confession than Holy Week. Tomorrow, Reconciliation Monday, would be the most opportune day. Confessions will be available from 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM – 9:00PM at Holy Name of Mary and in many, if not all, the parishes in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

If it has been a long time since you have gone to confession, or if you don’t know exactly what to say, or if you are very nervous, just tell the priest of Holy Name of Mary that you are friend of the Blessed Mother and he will make it as easy as possible for you.

Easter Sunday is approaching! Let us remain with Jesus in his Passion, death, and resurrection. Please know of my prayers for you at the upcoming Easter Sunday Masses.


